Zion Lutheran Church December 2024



Normally, by the time you are reading this December Tidings, you will be frantically gift shopping, putting up decorations, and watching the little ones anticipating Santa Claus. Christians around the world will be observing the liturgical season of Advent, or at least they should be. Advent comes from the Latin word "coming" and it is a time of preparation and anticipation for the coming of Christ. Remember, however, that it is a preparation and anticipation season of His second coming for us and not as the child born of a virgin. There was an advent of the Messiah fulfilled with Jesus coming as a child, who saved all humankind. We remember His past incarnation as the baby Jesus, but look in the future because our Advent is His promised second coming as Christ Triumphant. In the Lutheran Church there have been many traditions observed during Advent that help Christians to both prepare for and anticipate His coming at this time. Martin Luther encouraged families to observe Advent as a time for them to teach their children about the coming of Christ.

Advent is the beginning of our church year, so on the first day of Advent we also celebrate our new year. Advent always starts on the Sunday closest to St. Andrew's Day (November 30th) and continues for four Sundays until Christmas. We at Zion will have our church adorned in blue which is the color of anticipation and hope, but some churches will show the color of violet to recognize Advent as a time of preparation and repentance.

Christians in many countries have adopted various traditions of lighting candles during Advent to observe this as the time of the coming of Christ who is the light of the world. One widespread tradition is the use of an Advent wreath both in the church and the home to mark each Sunday in the Advent season. While the origin of this as an Advent tradition dates back to the Lutheran church following the Reformation, the current form commonly used today was developed more recently and is used in many other Christian churches throughout the world. The wreath is made out of evergreens in the shape of a circle to represent eternal life. It consisted of four candles originally: three purple or blue candles to match the liturgical colors and one pink candle lit on the 3rd Sunday in Advent. This 3rd Sunday is known as Gaudete Sunday, meaning "rejoice" in Latin and comes from Philippians 4:4. Lighting this 3rd candle, Christians relax the fast to rejoice that the promised Messiah is coming soon. Many Advent wreaths also have a 5th candle, the Christ candle, which is lit during the time of Christmas, symbolizing that Christ, the light of the world, has entered the darkness.

Another tradition, is the observance of special commemoration days during the season of Advent, namely St. Nicholas, Bishop of Myra on December 6th and St. Lucia, Martyr on December 13th. I am sure you recognize St. Nicholas, though most of the world knows him as: Santa Claus now. Regardless of how you celebrate Advent, just make sure you do. Make sure it is not just the lead up to Christmas, because we will have the Christmas Season in all its glory as well. This is a time though to prepare ourselves and others around us for the truth that, Christ our Lord will return. The day and hour should not concern us because we will be prepared at whatever time it might be.

During this very special season, God bless you and your families. Happy Advent, and a very Merry Christmas.

From Pastor John

THE HOLY WORK OF CHRISTMAS

May I ask you, what is the Holy work of Christmas? Let's turn to the gospel of St. Luke for the answer: "And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all that they had heard and seen, as it had been told them." Luke 2: 20. The Holy Work of Christmas is as it always has been since the beginning: to glorify God! It is not only pastors who can glorify God, not only laypersons who can glorify God on Sundays, not just missionaries, ministers, priests, rabbis or women of the

Bible that can glorify God. How many of us would be shut out from any opportunity of magnifying the Most High if this were the case. No! The shepherds went back to the sheep-pens and pastures glorifying and praising God.

Beloved, it is not the office or position that qualifies one to glorify God-it is earnestness! God is most surely glorified in the stall where the farrier does His work with horses while humming a hymn of the Savior's love. That is far more than a pastor's office where official religiousness performs its duties. The name of Jesus is glorified by the person who gives of their time, talent and treasure as much as any learned theologian.

The shepherds were not educated men. They didn't have books. But if your heart is right you will want to glorify God. Shepherds glorified God and so may you! Remember there is one thing the shepherds had over the Wise Men-the Wise Men wanted a star to guide them, but the shepherds did not. The shepherds went straight to Bethlehem. Simple minds sometimes find a glorified Christ where highly educated people sometimes miss Him.

The way in which the shepherds honored God is worth noticing. They did it by praising Him! Let us think more of sacred songs than we sometimes do. After all, the Angels appeared to them and sang the Gloria!

What is the great goal of all Christian effort? To glorify God! How? "The one who offers thanksgiving as his sacrifice glorifies me." says the Lord (Psalm 50:23). Let us sing then, my brothers and sisters in Christ! Luther's translations of the Psalms were as much service as his discussions and controversies.

Sing more and murmur less, sing more and gossip less, sing more and complain less, sing more and mourn less.

May God grant us, this Christmas and beyond, as the shepherds, the desire and determination to glorify God by praising Him! Let us each perform the Holy Work of Christmas!



Cheering on a Comeback

Like most sports fans, I love a good comeback! There's nothing quite like when a team mounts a comeback after falling hopelessly behind. It is thrilling to experience how the players, coaches, and fans rally to support one another and celebrate each step along the way just to get back into a position to potentially be victorious!

Recently, my wife and I came back: After a six-month absence from the church we attend when in town, we were finally able to come back to worship on a Sunday morning this month. Life and ministry commitments had us on the road since Easter and we truly missed the church that had become family to us. But the comeback we experienced was not personally thrilling for me. Instead, I sheepishly walked through those doors, wondering what people were thinking of us after all this time. I even found myself saying "the prodigals have returned" to one of my friends.

As I began to process it, my experience really bothered me. Why did I feel this way? No one was judgmental at all. Not one person asked, "where have you been?" Many greeted us with joyous expressions of welcome. So why did I, a minister of the Gospel who should definitely know better, feel such guilt and shame? And if I had this intense struggle, for how many others might similar feelings be an obstacle to coming back to church?

As we approach Advent and Christmas, we are more likely to encounter people who may not be in the pattern of attending church regularly. Many may be struggling with intense feelings of guilt and shame even thinking about returning to worship. Some of these feelings may get projected onto other church members, like my thinking we would be judged or looked down on. Other feelings might be more of an internal spiritual battle. Regardless, it is mission-critical for the church to cheer on the comeback.

If you haven't been active in church lately, I want my experience to be an encouragement for you. While the devil will use every trick he can to keep you away from the life-giving experience of a faith community gathered around word and sacrament, trust that God desires your presence and participation. I am confident that you will encounter a loving, welcoming reception by your church family who will celebrate your presence.

If you are a regular worshipper, please enthusiastically support and encourage any and all comebacks! Begin to pray daily for the Holy Spirit to gather those whom the Lord calls to come back to worship. Pray for God to bring to mind specific people to pray for and encourage. Perhaps God is leading you to reach out to someone. Be mindful to not inadvertently contribute to any feelings of guilt or shame. Instead, take an interest in them out of genuine love. Offer to meet for coffee or lunch. Find out what's going on in their lives and how you can pray for them. Consider inviting them to a special event, small group, or service project that gives the opportunity for casual, relational connection. And most importantly, when you see someone new or that you haven't seen for some time, warmly welcome them and simply let them know you are so happy to see them. These simple actions can make a difference as we cheer on a comeback!
